

WHERE WE ARE - DRAFT PROJECTS

- Evaluation of roadway projects completed
 - 541 individual candidate projects estimated at \$12 billion
 - 309 included in draft list estimated at \$6 billion
- Evaluation of stand-alone bike/pedestrian projects still underway
- Evaluation of high-capacity transit corridors still underway in conjunction with COTA NextGen process
 - Local or express bus routes not individually included in listing or map




FISCAL BALANCE

- Key determinant in what can be included in the MTP
 - Project cost estimates
 - Forecast of available funding resources
- Primary sources of project funding
 - Federal – generally controlled by ODOT or MORPC
 - State – generally controlled by ODOT
 - Local government or private
- Forecasts of funding available via various programs through 2040
- \$6 billion estimated for roadway expansion





Major Widening of Freeway	11	33	\$1,038
Interchange Modification	16	n/a	\$1,289
New Interchange	4	n/a	\$295
Convert to Freeway	4	18	\$272
Lane Management	4	42	\$424



Minor Widening	66	96	\$969
Intersection Modification	82	n/a	\$173
Access Management	5	27	\$17
Convert to Two-way	5	2	\$24
