


## What is the TIP?

The TIP provides our communities with the infrastructure they need to be safe and successful. It helps us ensure that these projects take place in a timely manner, with the necessary funding to make them possible. These projects invest around \$2 billion into the region.

## Examples of Projects




Building or widening major roads

## The TIP Process

As a designated metropolitan planning organization by the U.S. Department of Transportation, MORPC is regularly teaming up with our federal, state, and local partners to take a closer look at how our roadways, transit systems, bikeways and pedestrian pathways can be improved. This shared process is used to update the TIP every two years.


The TIP area consists of Franklin and Delaware counties, as well as portions of Fairfield and Licking counties. The projects are located throughout this entire area.

- 1 Updated every **two years**
- 2 **Opportunity for public comment** throughout the process
- 3 **Draft submitted** to federal, state, and local agencies
- 4 **Review and Approval** by MORPC transportation committees
- 5 ODOT and local governments **develop projects for construction**

## Why does it matter?

The upgrades in the TIP help us to respond to the shifting social, economic, environmental, and demographic makeup of our region for the better. By making improvements when possible, we are connecting people to one another – employees to employers, businesses to consumers, educators to students, and Central Ohio to markets around the world.

These projects give you more choice on such things as: whether to bike or drive to work, where you can quickly pick up that last-minute item you forgot to purchase, or how to respond to demographic and lifestyle changes expected for Central Ohio.
