


WHERE ARE WE IN THE PROCESS?





WHERE WE ARE - DRAFT PROJECTS

- Nearly 550 individual candidate roadway projects (\$12 billion)
- 309 included in draft list (\$6 billion)
 - 39 freeway related (\$3.3 billion)
 - 270 non-freeway (\$2.7 billion)




WHERE WE ARE - DRAFT PROJECTS

- Over 380 individual candidate bike/ped projects (\$882 million)
154 included in draft list (\$450 million)
 - 85 multi-use paths (\$271 million)
 - 26 bike lane or wide shoulder (\$78 million)
 - 6 sidewalk (\$12 million)
 - 37 TBD complete street facilities (\$89 million)






WHERE WE ARE - DRAFT PROJECTS



- Evaluation of high-capacity transit corridors still underway in conjunction with COTA NextGen process
- Local or express bus routes not individually included in listing or map




SUMMARY OF DRAFT ROADWAY PROJECTS






SUMMARY OF DRAFT BICYCLE & PEDESTRIAN PROJECTS





FISCAL BALANCE

- Key determinant in what can be included in the MTP
 - Project cost estimates & forecast of available funding resources
 - Maintain the existing system and expand the system
- Primary sources of project funding
 - Federal – generally controlled by ODOT or MORPC
 - State – controlled by ODOT or through programs like OPWC or CEAO
 - Local government or private
- Forecasts of funding available via various programs through 2040





COMMENTS RECEIVED

- 130 comments via web map Jan 1 – Feb 15
 - Most received on one project – 5 (ID 836)
- Several emails, phone calls, one letter
- Resulting changes to draft projects list:
 - Addition of 3 roadway projects
 - 1 roadway project removed
 - Addition of 2 bike/ped projects
 - 1 bike/ped project removed

- Full draft MTP document by early March
- Comment period through April 15
 - MTP open house March 15
- Plan adoption May


