


WHAT IS THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLAN (MTP)?

- Identifies regional transportation strategies and projects
- Long-range (20+ years)
- Fiscally constrained
- Examines environmental impacts
- Formal document submitted to ODOT and USDOT every 4 years

METROPOLITAN PLANNING AREA



The Metropolitan Transportation Plan includes only communities within the official MPO boundary.



WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- Central Ohio is growing
 - Demographics are changing
 - Preferences are changing
 - Demands on the transportation system are changing
- Transportation projects must be on MTP to be eligible for federal funding








POPULATION & EMPLOYMENT FORECASTS

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Transportation projects must be on MTP to be eligible for federal funding.

Recent Westerville projects utilizing MORPC-Attributable Funds (Federal, competitive)

Project	Construction Year	Total Project Cost	MORPC-Attributable Funding
Sunbury Rd. Major Widening (County Line to Maxtown)	2016-2017	\$7.5 million	\$4.9 million
Cleveland & Schrock Intersection Modification	2017-2018	\$15.2 million	\$6.4 million
Westerville Bikeway (SR-3 to Schrock)	2006	\$1 million	\$0.8 million










STRATEGY & PROJECT IDENTIFICATION
