

COMMUNITY PERSPECTIVES ON REGIONAL HOUSING NEEDS



Housing service providers and residents in Central Ohio believe housing should be offered at a wide range of price points, free from health hazards and accessible to all people regardless of age or special needs.

Preliminary Findings - November 2019

People in Central Ohio strongly believe that housing should be safe and near good schools, shopping, and amenities.



Most people assisted by regional housing providers access housing on their own (46 percent compared with 23 percent who access it through social service agencies).

The top three housing challenges consistently shared were:

- 1. Affordability
- 2. Availability
- 3. Creditworthiness

Among housing service providers, transportation and healthcare are considered the largest non-housing costs that affect their residents.



The top three non-housing costs were:

- 1. Healthcare (26%)
- 2. Transportation (25%)
- 3. Childcare (22%)



Among housing service providers working with residents in Central Ohio, the top three things to improve housing would be:

- 1. More housing at lower price points
- 2. Better quality of available housing
- 3. More housing for aging populations or people with disabilities.
