

SCOPE PART 1: Asset inventory & visioning



Develop local community engagement, visioning, and asset inventory to gain a better understanding of the value residents and businesses place on trails and the type of amenities that are available.

- Inventory wayfinding and current infrastructure
- Interview and/or survey local businesses, residents, and government officials
- Collect additional data points
- Use case studies to summarize local trail culture and unique elements





SCOPE PART 2: framework for a long-term guide



a detailed scope of work that lays out the different tasks and partnerships that need to be established to support a long-term trail town program that is regionally recognized and fits into the statewide context.

- Infrastructure, such as bike lanes, lighting, bike parking, and water fountains
- Local business collaborations
- Economic development catalysts, such as trail-themed restaurants and cafes, bed and breakfasts, or retail
- Tourism activities
- Cohesive Regional Trail Town Brand
- Wayfinding and art installations





SCOPE PART 3: local implementation




- Outline local community implementation proposals.
- A document will be created that identifies short-term, low-cost implementation strategies for each local sponsoring community.



• The strategies must include suggestions that may realistically be implemented within a short-time frame, such as by spring 2022.









IMPACTS OF TRAILS



Align data with philanthropic missions

RETURN ON INVESTMENT – IMPACT OF TRAILS



- **\$203 Million =** Estimated Cost of Building the Regional Trail Vision in Franklin County by 2030.
- 173 New Trail Miles Estimated in Franklin
 County
- ~\$1.2 Million / Trail Mile

\$350 Million	 Estimated economic total impact from construction costs
\$57 Million Annually	 Estimated health care savings
24.6 Million Miles Annually	 Reduction of Annual Vehicle Miles Traveled
\$1.2 Million Annually	 Estimated savings related to tree canopy benefits along the trail
\$2.2 Million Annually	 Estimated additional property tax revenue
