CITY OF NEW ALBANY

Objective: Increase local renewable energy generating capacity.

Eligible Activity: Solar panel project at Public Service

- 271 panels installed on public service garage.
- Removes 112 metric tons of CO₂ annually, the equivalent of planting 2,800 new trees.





CITY OF NEW ALBANY

- **Objective:** Reduce per capita energy consumption across all sectors.
- **Eligible Activity:** Prioritize energy performance and sustainability in the design and construction of existing and new builds through the Green Building Incentive Program.





CITY OF NEW ALBANY

Objective: Reduce the amount of municipal solid waste per capita disposed in the landfill.

Eligible Activity: Food waste composting program

- Over 15,000 pounds of food waste diverted from landfill so far.
