

Regional Trail Vision


500+ Proposed Trail Miles

230+ Existing Trail Miles












TRAIL TOWN FRAMEWORK







A Trail Town is a community through which a trail passes that supports trail users with services, promotes the trail to its residents, and embraces the trail as a resource to be protected and celebrated.








WHAT IS A TRAIL TOWN?

LEVERAGING THE STRENGTH OF THE CENTRAL OHIO GREENWAYS

Central Ohio Greenways (COG) is a trail network of national significance spanning 230+ miles, connecting Central Ohio to other parts of the state and country. These trails are traveled more than 12 million miles annually and provide economic, quality of life, and health benefits to the community. With Central Ohio expected to be a region of 3 million people by 2050 - bringing an increased demand for more walkable neighborhoods, transportation options, and outdoor recreational opportunities - trails have become even more critical to the livability of our growing region. The Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission's (MORPC) COG Board is committed to a vision to add over 500 miles of trails to the region while simultaneously celebrating the region as a hub of beautiful, scenic, nationally recognized trails that have the potential to draw tourists and deepen Central Ohioans' pride of place.

Recognizing the trail town approach as a way of leveraging trail tourism opportunities, as well as active transportation and guality of life benefits, COG sought professional consulting services from Cycle Forward and Toole Design to develop a framework for a regional initiative.

The consulting team and MORPC staff worked with a Steering Committee comprised of local community representatives and regional trail advocates to understand the appetite for supporting a regional trail town designation program and developing a framework for implementing the program.

A trail town designation program will be most successful when the regional collaborative approach is supported by local community action.

Local Placemaking "Menu"

While launching a trail town program is a substantial undertaking that will require dedicated regional and local support, a "lighter, guicker, cheaper" placemaking approach will realistically allow individual communities to advance their local efforts. Each item on this menu of placemaking options is anticipated to cost less than \$3000.

Eligibility Requirements Communities interested in participating in the program must:

- Accommodate trail users with business services; Be located within 2 miles
- of a Central Ohio Trail of Regional Significance;
- Declare a commitment to designation as a trail town via city or village council:
- Maintain designation from year to year: and
- Commit to active transportation infrastructure that allows people to safely walk and bike between the trail and community.








URBAN TRAIL TOWN COMMUNITIES




Any community who lives within 2 miles of a regional trail will have the opportunity to participate in it. This will include nearly, if not every, large community within Franklin County.
