## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATIONS TO ODOT FOR FY 24 TID SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR ADVANCEMENT OF TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND RELATED ACTIONS


#### Abstract

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Transportation Improvement District (the "FCTID") is authorized by ORC Chapter 5540 (1) to finance, construct, maintain, repair, and operate street, highway, and other transportation projects (including, but not limited to, air and rail projects); and (2) to construct, reconstruct, improve, alter, and repair roads, highways, public places, buildings, and other infrastructure;

WHEREAS, the transportation projects undertaken by the FCTID and exercise of its authority, pursuant to ORC Chapter 5540, are considered to be essential and to contribute to the improvement of the prosperity, health, safety, and welfare of the people of Franklin County, Ohio (the "County"), various local political subdivisions located within the County, the region and the State of Ohio (the "State"), and are essential governmental functions that will also promote industry, commerce, distribution, and research activity within the County, the region and the State;


WHEREAS, it is also envisioned and intended that the ongoing efforts of the FCTID will assist and provide greater efficiencies to the ongoing transportation infrastructure and related improvement efforts in the County, and in relationship and coordination with the Ohio Department of Transportation ("ODOT"), the Ohio Development Services Agency ("DSA"), Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission ("MORPC"), Ohio Public Works Commission ("OPWC") and various other local political subdivisions and other agencies and offices within the County, including, but not limited to, the Franklin County Engineer's Office ("FCEO") and the Franklin County Department of Economic Development \& Planning ("FCEDP") and the business community, and neighboring communities and counties, as applicable or appropriate, in advancing transportation improvements, and related economic development and job retention and creation, which is vital to the long term mobility and economic prosperity of the County, the local political subdivisions within the County, the region and the State and their people;

WHEREAS, the FCTID consistent with its purpose and mission, including the designation and development of projects as designated by its Board of Trustees under ORC Chapter 5540, empowers the various political subdivisions and their respective residents and other agencies within the County, to participate in a cooperative county-wide coalition to take advantage of the opportunities and benefits made available through a Transportation Improvement District ("TID") to plan, fund, construct and improve highways, roads, bridges, interchanges and other transportation improvements and accompanying capital improvements and development throughout the County and its environs, utilizing a program-level
development approach for integration of local transportation projects and which program of transportation projects is intended to be amended and supplemented as appropriate to add, from time to time, as feasible and appropriate, additional Projects and which is referred to as the "FCTID Program of Projects, as further set forth and described on documents on file with the FCTID (the "Identified Projects").

WHEREAS, the Identified Projects in the FCTID Program of Projects are transportation and/or local infrastructure improvement projects, as contemplated by ORC Chapter 5540, that involve or contemplate a coordinated, cooperative, multi-jurisdictional approach towards project integration, development, design and construction, land use planning, environmental stewardship, financial strategy implementation, economic development and public-private partnership opportunities to advance these projects in an innovative, efficient and cost effective manner;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the FCTID has recognized that it is a priority that the FCTID engage and coordinate with the County, the FCEO, FCEDP, various local political subdivisions within the County and the State to the greatest extent practical in development of transportation improvements and related activities within Franklin County and its environs and the region, such as by advancing the Identified Projects; and

WHEREAS, the FCTID intends to identify, further study, develop, implement and/or secure necessary funding from available revenue sources for these Identified Projects, in such phases and manner as determined to be feasible, practicable, and as may be agreed upon by the FCTID Board of Trustees and/or local implementation and potential funding partners including, but not limited to, the County and, as appropriate and feasible, certain other local political subdivisions within the County and/or private sector sources, and in further coordination and cooperation with ODOT, DSA, MORPC and/or OPWC, and in such amounts as determined to be available, adequate and feasible for advancement of Identified Projects and consistent, as applicable, with the ODOT Project Development Process or "PDP" and other applicable laws and regulations;

WHEREAS, the FCTID and the County have entered into an intergovernmental agreement relating to these cooperative and collaborative efforts, referenced above, to advance the Identified Projects/FCTID Program of Projects with a related pledge of funding from the County in accordance with ORC Sections 5540.02 (F);

WHEREAS, ODOT intends to accept applications for TID Supplemental Funding, through its Division of Jobs \& Commerce ("ODOT J\&C"), for selected TID projects, which requires registered and eligible TIDs to make application for such Fiscal Year 24 project funding to ODOT within given submittal deadlines (the FY 24 TID Supplemental Funding");

WHEREAS, the FCTID is accordingly registered with ODOT as an eligible TID and intends to apply for this FY 24 TID Supplemental Funding that may be available, so as to further advance, as now determined to be appropriate and timely, two of the Identified Projects, to wit: the Rohr Road at SR 317 Improvement Project; and the Walnut Street at SR 605 Improvements Project, in coordination and cooperation with the FCEO/County and other appropriate implementation partners;

WHEREAS, the FCTID, pursuant to ORC Section 5540.03 is authorized to take such actions, receive such funding, and enter into all agreements necessary or incidental to performance of its functions and the execution of its powers to effect its purposes and transportation projects and the FCTID is specifically authorized to construct and fund transportation projects, and to pay related costs incurred thereto in the exercise of its functions under ORC Chapter 5540; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the FCTID Board of Trustees (the "Board") hereby proclaims the importance of further assisting, in conjunction with the FCEO, the County and other implementation partners, with advancing and funding the development and implementation of the Rohr Road at SR 317 Improvement Project; and the Walnut Street at SR 605 Improvements Project by applying for the FY 24 TID Supplemental Funding, and which projects will address, in various respects, vital capacity, safety and congestion issues, benefiting the traveling public and residents of the area and the region, as well as freight and logistics movements, and significantly facilitate and provide for economic expansion and development in and around the project area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves and authorizes that the FCTID Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Secretary-Treasurer, in consultation with FCTID legal counsel, prepare and submit to ODOT, through its Office of Jobs \& Commerce, appropriate funding applications for FY 24 TID Supplemental Funding for: the Rohr Road at SR 317 Improvement Project; and the Walnut Street at SR 605 Improvements Project, and/or such other projects as determined by the FCTID Chair to be appropriate and feasible, including, but not limited to, a joint funding application in collaboration with the Licking County TID, and to apply for such funding, in such eligible amounts as determined feasible and appropriate by the FCTID Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Secretary-Treasurer, in consultation with the FCEO, and that the taking of any such action and the execution and delivery of any related documents, agreements or instruments, including, but not limited to, funding agreements with ODOT or project partner funding agreements, by the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Secretary-Treasurer shall be conclusive evidence of the Board's determination that such actions are proper, authorized, approved and necessary in order for the FCTID to carry out the purposes of this resolution and of the authorization thereof by the Board.

WHEREAS, the transportation projects undertaken by the FCTID and exercise of its authority, pursuant to ORC Chapter 5540, are considered to be essential and to contribute to the improvement of the prosperity, health, safety, and welfare of the people of Franklin County, Ohio (the "County"), various local political subdivisions located within the County, the region and the State of Ohio (the "State"), and are essential governmental functions that will also promote industry, commerce, distribution, and research activity within the County, the region and the State;

WHEREAS, the FCTID, consistent with its purpose and mission, including the designation and development of projects as designated by its Board of Trustees under ORC Chapter 5540, empowers the various political subdivisions within the County, to participate in a cooperative county-wide coalition to take advantage of the opportunities and benefits made available through a Transportation Improvement District to plan, fund, construct and improve highways, roads, bridges, interchanges, parking facilities and other transportation improvements and accompanying capital improvements and development throughout the County and its environs, utilizing a program-level development approach for integration of local transportation projects, and which program of transportation projects referred to as the "FCTID Program of

Projects", as further set forth, developed and described on documents on file with the FCTID and FCEO, is intended to be amended and supplemented as appropriate to add additional projects, from time to time, as feasible and appropriate;

WHEREAS, the FCTID now intends to add to the FCTID Program of Projects the following transportation improvement projects:

1) The Trabue Road at Hauge Avenue Improvements Project, a collaborative project between the FCTID and the County, with the potential participation of a private developer, for the improvements to the intersection of Trabue Road and Hauge Avenue, in such phases as determined appropriate and feasible by the FCTID and FCEO, and as further set forth, developed and described in accordance with documents and plans on file with the FCEO, and FCTID, and funded with available revenues pledged or made available to the FCTID from the County and the private developer, or other identified available funding sources (the "Trabue Road at Hauge Avenue Improvements Project"); and
2) The US 62 Corridor Improvements Project, a collaborative project between the FCTID, the County, ODOT, and other potential local partners, for the improvements to the US 62 Corridor from Smith's Mill Road to the Franklin County Line, in such phases as determined appropriate and feasible ny the FCTID and FCEO, and as further set forth, developed and described in accordance with documents and plans on file with the FCEO, and FCTID, and funded with available revenues pledged or made available to the FCTID from the County and the private developer, or other identified available funding sources (the "US 62 Corridor Improvements Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County and the FCTID, to further develop, facilitate, enhance, fund and promote transportation improvements within the County and the region, through intergovernmental cooperation and coordination by the FCTID and to advance the FCTID Program of Projects, entered into an intergovernmental agreement on file with the FCTID and the County, dated and entered into on November 26, 2019, as amended (the "IGA");

WHEREAS, the County and the FCTID, in furtherance of these goals, intend, pursuant to Section 1.02 (a) of the IGA, to approve and authorize an updated and amended Exhibit A "Identified Projects - Franklin County Transportation Improvement District Program List January 2023 ", attached hereto and referred to as "Exhibit A" to the IGA, to reflect this additional project referenced above; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the FCTID Board of Trustees (the "Board") does hereby designate and adds to the FCTID Program of Projects the Trabue Road at Hauge Avenue Improvements Project, and the US 62 Corridor Improvements Project, in accordance with and pursuant to ORC Sections 5540.01 (C), 5540.02 (F), 5540.03 (A) (4), (8) and (10) and related sections and FCTID Resolution 2019-02.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board approves and authorizes updated and amended Exhibit A to the IGA, in substantially the form attached hereto with only such changes as determined by the FCTID Secretary-Treasurer in consultation with FCTID Legal Counsel to not be materially adverse to the FCTID, and which Exhibit A is to be substituted for any prior versions by the FCTID Secretary-Treasurer, contingent upon reciprocal approval by the Franklin County Board of Commissioners, and that the taking of any such action and the execution and
delivery of any related documents, agreements or instruments with the County or other cooperative agreements with implementation partners, by the FCTID Secretary-Treasurer shall be conclusive evidence of the Board's determination that such actions are proper, authorized, approved and necessary in order for the FCTID to carry out the purposes of this resolution and of the authorization thereof by the Board.

It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### Abstract

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Transportation Improvement District (the "FCTID") is authorized by ORC Chapter 5540 (1) to finance, construct, maintain, repair, and operate street, highway, and other transportation projects (including, but not limited to, bike/pedestrian, parking facilities, air and rail projects); and (2) to construct, reconstruct, improve, alter, and repair roads, highways, public places, buildings, and other infrastructure;


WHEREAS, the transportation projects undertaken by the FCTID and exercise of its authority, pursuant to ORC Chapter 5540, are considered to be essential and to contribute to the improvement of the prosperity, health, safety, and welfare of the people of Franklin County, Ohio (the "County"), various local political subdivisions located within the County, the region and the State of Ohio (the "State"), and are essential governmental functions that will also promote industry, commerce, distribution, and research activity within the County, the region and the State;

WHEREAS, the FCTID, consistent with its purpose and mission, including the designation and development of projects as designated by its Board of Trustees under ORC Chapter 5540, empowers the various political subdivisions, including, but not limited to, the City of Columbus, Ohio, and their respective residents and other agencies and offices within the County, to participate in a cooperative county-wide coalition to take advantage of the opportunities and benefits made available through a Transportation Improvement District to plan, fund, construct and improve highways, roads, bridges, interchanges, parking facilities and other transportation improvements and accompanying capital improvements and development throughout the County and its environs, utilizing a program-level development approach for integration of local transportation projects, and which program of transportation projects referred to as the "FCTID Program of Projects", as further set forth, developed and described on documents on file with the FCTID and the FCEO, is intended to be amended and supplemented as appropriate to add additional projects, from time to time, as feasible and appropriate;

WHEREAS, the FCTID previously added to the FCTID Program of Projects the Trabue Road at Hague Avenue Improvements Project, a collaborative project between the FCTID, the County, and private developers, as appropriate, for such project phases and segments as determined appropriate and feasible by the FCTID, in coordination and collaboration with the FCEO and other local jurisdictions and private sector entities with interests in the project area, including, but not limited to, Trabue Links, LLC, and related future roadway improvements in the Trabue Road at Hague Avenue project area, as warranted by future conditions determined by the FCEO in coordination with the FCTID, and as further set forth, described and to be developed in accordance with documents and plans on file with the FCTID and FCEO, and
funded with available revenues pledged or made available to the FCTID from state or local governments, private funding sources, including, but not limited to, Trabue Links, LLC, or other identified available funding sources (referred to hereafter as the "Project");

WHEREAS, based upon traffic impact studies of development activities in and around the Project area, it is anticipated that certain roadway related improvements will be required, as further set forth designated and to be developed on the plans and documents on file with the FCEO, and such other related improvements in the Project area (the "Improvements"), and Trabue Links, LLC expressed their commitment to provide funding to the FCTID in the amount necessary for funding these Improvements, as warranted by future conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the FCTID Board of Trustees (the "Board") approves, authorizes and directs the FCTID Chair or Secretary-Treasurer, in consultation with FCTID Legal Counsel, to prepare and execute an appropriate funding agreement between the FCTID, and Trabue Links, LLC relating to the Improvements, in accordance with and pursuant to ORC Section 5540.03 (A) (4), (8) and (10) and related sections and in furtherance of FCTID Resolution 2019-04 and related legislation and agreements, to provide for securing and accepting a portion of project funding from Trabue Links, LLC as required to advance such Improvements in an amount of $\$ 49,113.00$ payable to the FCTID for construction costs, or such other amounts as solely determined by the FCTID Chair or SecretaryTreasurer in conjunction with the FCEO to be adequate and appropriate for the required work and which shall be conclusive evidence of the Board's determination that such actions are proper, authorized, approved and necessary in order for the FCTID to carry out the purposes of this resolution and of the authorization thereof by the Board, and that the taking of any such action and the execution and delivery of any related documents, agreements or instruments and other project cooperation and funding agreements with respective project implementation partners.
