## C. Approval of Minutes from April 22, 2021 Meeting

## D. FCTID Program of Projects

Mr. Crosier updated the board on the Toy Road, Swisher Road, Saltzgaber Road Improvement Project, stating that Shelly \& Sands is the contractor for this project, and they are planning for a June 1, 2021 closure of Toy Road. Substantial competition of the project is scheduled for Fall of 2021, with full completion of the project anticipated in Spring of 2022. Mr. Crosier noted that the FCTID is pursuing $\$ 350,000$ for this project through the ODOT TID Supplemental Funding program.

Mr. Crosier updated the board on the Franklin County Parking Facilities Improvement Project. The pedestrian bridge demolition related work is nearing final completion. Mr. Crosier informed the board that the 50 East Mound Street surface parking facility has received approval from the Downtown Commission.

Mr. Crosier explained that the upcoming I-70/I-71 4R and 6R phases are expected to begin construction in Spring of 2022. Mr. Crosier explained that the FCTID will need to secure a contractor to complete work related to the impacts of 4 R and 6R on adjacent Franklin County Parking Facilities after the $4 R$ and $6 R$ contract has been awarded.

## 1. Resolution Number 2021-04 Amending the Intergovernmental Agreement with the County and Related Actions

Mr. Crosier introduced Resolution 2021-04 explaining that this resolution authorized the FCTID to enter into a task order agreement with ms consultants for consulting and engineering services related to future phases of the Franklin County Parking Facilities Improvement Project, in an amount not to exceed $\$ 100,000$. Ms. Griffin asked if ms consultants had any minority participation on this project. Mr. Crosier explained that the scope of work with ms consultants has not yet been finalized, but the FCTID would seek opportunities to include minority subconsultants in the scope

Ms. Griffin asked for clarification regarding a reference to the date of the ms consultants proposal in the resolution. Mr. Crosier explained that ms consultants has not yet provided a proposal. Ms. Griffin recommended that the reference to the date of the proposal be struck from the resolution. The board agreed that the resolution should be amended to remove reference to this date.

Motion by Williams, seconded by Woodruff to adopt Resolution 2021-04 as amended to authorize a task order agreement with ms consultants and amend the intergovernmental agreement with the county.

governments, private funding sources, including, but not limited to, the AJV, or other identified available funding sources (referred to hereafter as the "Cassady Avenue Corridor" or the "Project");

WHEREAS, based upon traffic impact studies of development activities in and around the Project area, it is anticipated that certain roadway related improvements will be required, as further set forth designated and to be developed on the plans and documents on file with the FCEO, and such other related improvements in the Project area (the "Improvements"), and AJV has expressed its commitment to provide funding to the FCTID in the amount necessary for funding these Improvements, as warranted by future conditions;
