CORPO Safety Action Plan Adopted

CORPO received a funding award in 2022 from the <u>Safe</u> <u>Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) federal discretionary</u> <u>grant program</u> to develop a comprehensive safety action plan for CORPO's seven-county area that identifies the most significant roadway safety concerns and develops a comprehensive approach to prevent fatalities and serious injuries from occurring in the future. Development of this Safety Action Plan for the CORPO Planning Area **makes all communities within the CORPO area eligible to apply for Implementation Grants through the SS4A** <u>Program</u>, which provide federal funds to implement projects and strategies identified in the Plan.

The plan establishes a vision for a safe transportation system for all users and identifes strategies and action items to make progress toward this visions. The plan also establishes a **target of 2% annual reduction in fatalities and serious injuries, to move toward the ultimate target of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries.**

1.5 Leadership Commitment and Goal Setting

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As illustrated by the chart in Figure 1.3 below, over the five-year period between 2016 and 2022, Itaffic crashes in the CORPO region accounted for approximately 381 serious injuries and 65 fatalities, on average. That equates to more than 400 people per year who are serious injured or Nilko' simply while traveling on our region's roadways.

Funding Applications & Opportunities Update

CORPO Staff are available to assist with funding applications and technical assistance.

- Township Safety Sign Program- Up to \$50K in signs, posts, and hardware to improve the safety of their roadways based on previous 5 yrs. crash history. Any township which has not previously been funded is eligible to apply. A reminder will be emailed to eligible CORPO townships. The deadline to apply is June 7.
- Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A), USDOT- 2 types of grants available- Planning & Demonstration and Implementation. Planning & Demonstration funds action plans, as well as supplemental planning activities and demonstration activities in support of an action plan. Implementation grants fund projects to implement actions identified in action plan. Two deadlines-May 16 & August 29. The deadline for Implementation grants is May 16.
- Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program- This is a new federal competitive grant program to construct projects to provide safe and connected active transportation facilities in active transportation networks or active transportation spines. ATIIP will award two types of grants: Planning and Design grants and Construction grants. FHWA will award Planning and Design grants for eligible applicants to develop plans for active transportation networks and active transportation spines. The deadline to apply is June 17.
- Small City Program, ODOT- This program provides federal funds to small cities with populations from 5,000 to 24,999 that are not located within a MPO's boundaries. This program may be used for any road, safety, or signal project on the Federal-aid system, with a project funding limit of \$2 million per project. Eligible cities in CORPO are Circleville, London, and Mt. Vernon. The deadline to apply is June 15.
- Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Abbreviated Safety Application, ODOT- This program is intended to fund potentially less complex safety improvements quickly. Eligible projects need to be simple (under \$500,000 and must be constructed within 2 years), utilize proven safety countermeasures, and be in a location with 3 crashes per year. Applications are due for review 4 times per year and the next window closes June 30.
- HSIP Formal Safety Application, ODOT-Complex safety improvements and is meant to address locations with a history of fatal or injury crashes. Funding priority is given to locations with state or regional safety priority or a completed local road safety plan. A minimum of 3 crashes per year and 30% injury crashes are required to apply. Applications are due for review 2 times per year. The next window closes August 31.

CORPO Committee May Meeting Recap

The CORPO Committee met for their biannual meeting on May 6, 2024. <u>See the meeting packet here</u>. At the meeting, the Committee...

- Passed <u>Resolution 1-24</u>, adopting the fiscal year 2025 Planning Work Program (viewable on the <u>CORPO webpage</u>).
- Passed <u>Resolution 2-24</u>, adopting the <u>CORPO Safety Action Plan</u> and adopting the target to reduce fatalities and serious injury crashes on CORPO roadways by 2% annually.
- Passed <u>Resolution 3-24</u>, awarding CORPO Dedicated Funds to five projects and completing the awarding of funds for the CORPO Dedicated Funds Fiscal Year 2024-2025 round. Approximately \$2.1 million in funds has been awarded to 7 projects in Fairfield, Knox, Madison, and Union counties. <u>Information about the awarded projects is available on the CORPO webpage</u>.

TRAC Applications Open

The Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) evaluates funding applications that result in ODOT's largest transportation project investments, and CORPO & MORPC assist by evaluating applications which fall within their transportation planning boundaries, then providing the region's project priorities to the TRAC. <u>TRAC applications close May 31</u>.
