

# Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Federal Grant Award

- Application Round: Year 1 (FY22)
- Funding Awarded: \$200,000 for Planning
- Purpose: Develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for <u>CORPO</u> area
- Timeline: Fall 2023 through Spring 2024
- Goal: Coordinate with local agencies interested in applying for Implementation Grant in future years



• Total Fatalities: 324








#### Fatalities & Serious Injuries (2018 – 2022)



# **Leadership Commitment** and **Goal Setting**


Target to reduce fatalities and serious injuries by 2% annually, and move toward the ultimate goal of zero roadway fatalities and serious injuries.

 CORPO Committee adopted plan in May and endorsed target for CORPO by Resolution



## Action Plan – Strategies

- **Safe Road Users-** Encourage safe and responsible behavior for all road users by providing the services, conditions, education, and enforcement that prioritize their safety.
- Safe Vehicles- Explore opportunities for education, research, and deployment of vehicle systems, features, and other technologies that help to prevent and mitigate the severity of crashes.
- **Safe Speeds-** Promote context-appropriate speeds through roadway design, education, and enforcement that prioritizes safety.
- **Safe Roads-** Create a transportation system that encourages safe behavior, accommodates human mistakes, reduces the severity of crashes, and facilitates safe travel for all road users.
- **Post-Crash Care-** Enhance the survivability of crashes by improving incident response systems as well as management practices that help to prevent secondary crashes.
- **Safe System-** Collaborate across the Safe System Approach elements to identify and implement solutions that will reduce fatalities and serious injuries throughout Central Ohio.


