

Appendix K- Pickaway County Components

The 2023-2050 CORPO Transportation Plan is updated every five years and covers transportation needs for the entire region. The plan includes regional transportation goals, objectives, and performance measures, summarizes population and economic trends for the CORPO planning area, describes CORPO's multimodal transportation system and its conditions, and identifies strategies and projects associated with the management and development of the CORPO transportation system.

This County Components appendix is intended to supplement the content in the 2023-2050 CORPO Transportation Plan document, providing a copy of the seven-county information included in the document, with a highlighted focus on data for Fairfield County.





Figure K. 1 Projected Population, Households, and Jobs Growth











Figure K. 6 Percent of Population Age 5 years & over, LEP, 2010 & 2021

Figure K. 7 Percent of Population* with Denoted Disabilities by County, 2021




POPULATION IN POVERTY


Figure K. 9 Percent of Population under 200% Federal Poverty Line, 2010 & 2021

Figure K. 10 Total Employment Trend, 2021-2050






Figure K. 12 Fairfield County Unemployment Compared to CORPO, Historic & Forecasted


Figure K. 13 Share of Employment by Industry, 2021


Figure K. 15 Household Size, 2010 & 2021

Figure K. 16 Median Household Income, 2010 & 2021 (Inflation Adjusted to 2021 Dollars)








Figure K. 20 Housing Tenure by County, 2010 & 2021

Figure K. 21 Commuting Pattern for Workers who Live in Pickaway County, 2020








Figure K. 23 State & CORPO Mean Commute Times, 2010 & 2021

Figure K. 24 Percent of Households with No Vehicle, 2010 & 2021





Figure K. 25 Pickaway County Sum of Lane Miles by Functional Classification, 2023



Figure K. 26 Pickaway County Roadway Functional Classification, 2022





Figure K. 27 Pickaway County VMT by Year, 2013-2022






Figure K. 29 2022 Pickaway County VMT by Functional Classification

Figure K. 32 Pickaway County AM Peak Congestion, 2023




Figure K. 33 Pickaway County PM Peak Congestion, 2023

F.3 Pickaway County Projects

To carry out the strategies, priority transportation projects have been identified through data analysis and stakeholder engagement. The projects include those that add roadway capacity, provide bicycle and pedestrian facilities, or enhance transit systems.
