AGENDA

1. Welcome

The Regional Trail Vision was initially adopted in 2018, including over 500 miles of proposed trails. The Central Ohio Greenways Board has expanded the vision to 15 counties, prompting outreach to additional counties. The annual update process allows the Trail Development Working Group to recommend new Trails of Regional Significance

2. Regional Trail Vision Updates Recommendations

Southeast Area Updates

- Hocking Adena Trail (20 miles proposed)
- Buckeye Lake & Lancaster (OU-L) Connection (6 miles proposed, 4 miles existing)
- Buckeye Lake Loop to Pickerington (30 miles proposed, 5 miles existing)
- Scioto Trail Realignment to Commercial Point (3.5 miles proposed)

The Working Group agreed to recommend all these projects for inclusion in the vision.

Northeast Area Updates

- Johnstown-Sunbury-Centerburg Triangle (Silicon Heartland Trails) (21 miles proposed)
- Delaware Run and Berlin Connector (24 miles proposed)
 Discussed feasibility, including necessary bridge improvements.
- Further input from local townships was recommended.
- Alum Creek Trail Realignment
- Delaware State Park Connections (17 miles proposed)
- Owl Creek Trail Extension (13 miles proposed, 2.25 miles existing)
- Newark & Heath to Buckeye Lake (2 miles proposed, 5.5 miles existing)

All projects were recommended for inclusion, with further review on some details.

Southwest Area Updates

- Scioto Trail Extension to Chillicothe (15 miles proposed)
- Paint Creek Recreational Trail (30 miles existing)
- Darby Creek Realignment
 Discussion on feasibility concerns due to environmental restrictions. Section 1,
 Section 2, and the Darby Creek Connector were approved for recommendation, with further study needed on the middle section.

The Working Group approved the Scioto Trail Extension, Paint Creek Trail, and a portion of the Darby Creek Realignment for inclusion.

Northwest Area Updates

- Innovation Route (20 miles proposed)
- Indian Lake to Marysville (25 miles proposed)
 Further discussion needed to ensure alignment with local plans.
- Indian Lake Loop (17 miles proposed, 3 miles existing)
 Discussion with Logan County stakeholders required before inclusion.
- Sugar Run Trail (4.5 miles proposed, 0.5 miles existing)
 Additional coordination with stakeholders needed before inclusion.
- Simon Kenton Trail Extension (8 miles proposed)
- Cardinal Trail (18 miles proposed)
 Discussion indicated it was misclassified and should not be included.

The Working Group approved the Innovation Route, while other northwest area trails will undergo further discussions before being added.

Marion County Updates

- Tall Grass Trail Extension (2.5 miles proposed)
- Marion Trails (3.5 miles proposed, 0.5 miles existing)

Both Marion County projects were recommended for inclusion.

3. Other Business

Updates to the public GIS map will be made available after COG Board adoption.



REGIONAL TRAIL VISION UPDATES



- The Regional Trail Vision Map is a network of 700+ existing and proposed Trails of Regional Significance that spans 7 counties in Central Ohio. The Regional Trail Vision Map was originally adopted in 2018 by the COG Board and MORPC's commission.
 - The Regional Trail Vision Map may be updated annually. Candidate Trails of Regional Significance must be recommended to the board by the COG Trail Development Working Group during a COG Board Meeting. The COG Board may choose to adopt an updated Regional Trail Vision Map if the adopted update adheres to the definitions as described in this document.




CENTRAL OHIO GREENWAYS TRAIL OF REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

 A Trail of Regional Significance is a primary trail, predominantly off-street, multi-jurisdictional, and connects people to major destination points.

These trails have a well maintained, improved surface and should prioritize comfort and safety for trail users. In locations where Trails of Regional Significance intersect or conflict with vehicular traffic, the trail should be emphasized as highly as practicable. Landscaping and buffering should be incorporated into the design of these trails. Access to amenities, such as restrooms, drinking fountains, and parking should be provided periodically. Wayfinding, snow & ice removal, maintenance, and 24/7 access of Trails of Regional Significance are critical to ensure that reliable and equitable access is provided to all users






REGIONAL TRAIL VISION PROGRESS >>>>

LINKUS advances COG


- 189 miles of proposed COG trails in the COTA Service Area (CSA)
- 175 of these are eligible for TSI funding (i.e., within 3-miles of a fixed-route transit stop)
- 37 miles (20%) are in the 2025-2030 TSI CIP
 - 27 (**15%**) of these are slated for construction by 2030
 - 10 (5%) of these (mostly Heritage Trail) have project development funding



REGIONAL TRAIL VISION PROGRESS >>>>

MORPC Attributable Funds advances COG

- 15 miles (8%) have received 2020 or 2022 Attributable Funding awards
 - 5 of these are also in the TSI CIP
- 5.3 miles are in outstanding 2024 applications (3.7-mi. overlap w/TSI)
- TSI and past AF awards have funded 50 miles, or 26%, of the COG vision in the CSA for construction or project development by 2030.
 - 40 miles, or 21%, are specifically slated for construction by 2030




CENTRAL OHIO GREENWAYS GATEWAY OF REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

Trailheads are the backbone of any trail wayfinding system. As Gateways to both trails and the places they run through, trailheads have extraordinary capacity to influence trail users' wayfinding experience – and thereby their overall experience of the trails.

A Gateway of Regional Significance is a premier trailhead located along a Trail of Regional Significance that provides and/or connects trail users to amenities, services, and information necessary to navigate the trail system.





PREMIER TRAILHEADS | COMMUNITY GATEWAY




Trailheads are the backbone of any trail wayfinding system. As gateways to both trails and the places they run through, trailheads have extraordinary capacity to influence trail users' wayfinding experience — and thereby their overall experience of trails. This chapter reviews the current state of wayfinding support offered via trailheads along the Ohio to Erie Trail in Central Ohio and provides recommendations for optimizing these spaces to better serve trail users with the information and amenities they need.






Fairfield, Hocking, Perry, & Pickaway Counties



Hocking Adena Trail

- Extend vision for southeast connection parallel to US RT 33.
- Potential to connect to Hocking Hills
 State Park and Athens.
- No specific ROW identified.
- Approximately 20 miles of proposed trail.
- Recommended by: ODOT /Toole
 Design Hocking Adena Trail
 Extension...





Buckeye Lake & Lancaster (OU-L)


- North-south connection along SR 37.
- Ends at OU-Lancaster, which currently has an SUP connecting to the rest of Lancaster.
 - This SUP is not on the COG Vision.


Approximately 6 miles of proposed trail and 4 miles of

 Transportation Plan






Buckeye Lake Loop to Pickerington (Terry's Dream)

- This trail would connect Buckeye
 Lake to Pickerington and the
 Columbus area.
- It would also create a loop around Buckeye Lake.
- Some segments of the Loop are already complete.
- Approximately 30 miles of proposed trail and 5 miles of existing trail.
- Recommended by : Bike Buckeye
 Lake, Fairfield County









Scioto Trail Realignment to Commercial Point

- The Village of Commercial Point has some ROW/easement on the west side of the Scioto.
- A portion of the trail will be built as part of a new industrial development in a flood.
- ODOT projects along SR 762 could facilitate trail.
- Approximately 3.5 miles of proposed trail.
- Recommended by: Commercial Point


Northeast Area Updates

Delaware, Knox, Licking, & Morrow Counties



Johnstown-Sunbury-Centerburg Triangle (Silicon Heartland Trails)

- Potential rail-trail between
 Centerburg and Johnstown –
 connect through Hartford.
- Centerburg-Johnstown
 - Approximately 10 miles of proposed trail.
- Sunbury-Johnstown
 - Approximately 11 miles of proposed trail.
- Recommended by: "Trails in the Intel Region" meeting, Trail Town Working Group, Delaware County



Delaware Run and/or Berlin Connector

- Could extend beyond Scioto Trail and O2E into neighboring counties/communities
- ODNR trail project in Alum Creek State Park
- Delaware Run
 - Approximately 12 miles of proposed trail
- Berlin Connector
 - Approximately 12 miles of proposed trail
- Alum Creek legs
 - Approximately 7 miles of proposed trail
- Recommended by: MORPC TA Program services with Berlin Township and City of Delaware.
- Is one connection preferred?






Alum Creek Realignment

- Trail along Bale Kenyon has seen completion of the first phase, which goes under 71.
- Approximately 1.5 miles of trail
- Recommended by: Orange Township and DCEO
- Does this need any realignments?
 - Maybe a more feasible but less pretty alternative to current gap in Alum Creek Trail.






Delaware State Park Connections




- East-west connection.

 - Approximately 15 miles of proposed trail.

- Recommended by: Delaware County Planning Commission






Owl Creek Trail Extension

- Potential new connection to OTET.
- Approximately 11 miles of proposed trail and 2.25 miles of existing trail.
- Recommended by: Mt Vernon and Knox County.









Newark & Heath to Buckeye Lake


Fayette, Madison, & Ross Counties



Scioto Trail Extension to Chillicothe

- Chillicothe has new UNESCO World Heritage site.
- TOSRV bike tour follows this route.
- Approximately 15 miles of proposed trail.
- Visionary Connection. Need a project sponsor. Consideration for future addition






Paint Creek Recreational Trail

- ~30-mile existing MUP connecting Chillicothe and Washington Courthouse.
- Access to numerous cultural amenities, including UNESCO World Heritage Sites.
- Approximately 30 miles of existing trail.
- Recommended by: Ross County Parks District






Darby Creek Realignment

- Proposed north-south alignment connecting OTET with NW Columbus area.
- Likely more feasible than current parallel vision given environmental and ROW concerns.
- Approximately 30 miles of proposed trail.




Logan, Marion, & Union Counties

 Plan






Indian Lake to Marysville


- Connection from

Indian Lake Loop


- Some existing trail, remains to be filled in.

- Which alignment should be included in the vision?





- Recommended by: LUC






Cardinal Trail

 Trails Master Plan.






Tall Grass Trail Extension

- Recommended by: Marion County








Marion Trails


- Some existing trail at OSU-M, which could be a gateway.

- Is Marion a Trail Town?












Opportunities for 2025 GPS Workshops

• Enhance north-south connectivity between Columbus (and suburbs), Pickerington, and Lancaster.


Mostly Existing SUP. Is this a Trail?

 Recommended by: Fairfield County & Pickerington








Delaware-Ashley Connection




