#### Year-End Report

Regional Trail Vision

- Will add over 500 miles of trails.
- passing of the LinkUS initiative (Issue 47), in November secured funding for transit and trail infrastructure. \$60 million annually through 2050 will support sidewalks, bikeways, and trails.
- 189 miles of proposed trails, 175 of which are eligible for funding.
- Has been expanded to all 15 counties in the MORPC footprint

#### Central Ohio Greenways Trail Towns

- This program's aim is to foster community engagement with trails.
- The Trail Town Working Group received the 2024 Collaborative Achievement in Sustainability Award at the Summit on Sustainability.
- A branding effort is underway, including collectible badges for participating communities.
- Staff is exploring the OuterSpatial wayfinding app for better navigation and engagement.
- Staff is seeking operational funding for trail town initiatives through state and grant funding.
- Members are identifying community gateways and premier trailheads to enhance access and visibility.
- Staff encouraged communities to submit visionary projects for regional collaboration.

#### Central Ohio Greenways Partner Updates

Paint Creek Trail - Ted Hagarman, Ross County Park District

- The trail, initially established in 1994, connects multiple communities and features over 15 bridges. Plans include enhanced amenities such as water stations, bike racks, and signage.
- The Ross County Park District manages 22 miles of the trail, addressing erosion issues and trail maintenance. The Park District is working to establish more official trail towns and increase connectivity to Dayton and Xenia.

Trails & Tourism in Knox County – Olivia Toth, Knox County Convention & Visitors Bureau

- Knox County relies on trails as a core tourism asset. The County has four major trails, forming a key part of the Ohio to Erie Trail, and is developing a mobile-friendly Green Spaces Guide. The County also
- Engages in youth outreach through programs such as the "All Kids Bike" initiative.

Trails & Tourism in Fairfield County - Jonett Haberfield, Visit Fairfield County

- Fairfield County operates under two brands: Visit Fairfield County and Escape to Buckeye Lake., and promotes outdoor recreation through websites, social media, and printed guides. County staff work with Bike Buckeye Lake and other local organizations to expand cycling events and infrastructure
- The County plans to work on making Lancaster an official Trail Town







#### **LINKUS advances COG**


- 189 miles of proposed COG trails in the COTA Service Area (CSA)
- 175 of these are eligible for TSI funding (i.e., within 3-miles of a fixed-route transit stop)
- 37 miles (20%) are in the 2025-2030 TSI CIP
  - 27 (**15**%) of these are slated for construction by 2030
  - 10 (5%) of these (mostly Heritage Trail) have project development funding




## REGIONAL TRAIL VISION PROGRESS >>>>

### MORPC Attributable Funds advances COG

- 15 miles (8%) have received 2020 or 2022 Attributable Funding awards
  - 5 of these are also in the TSI CIP
- 5.3 miles are in outstanding 2024 applications (3.7-mi. overlap w/TSI)
- TSI and past AF awards have funded 50 miles, or 26%, of the COG vision in the CSA for construction or project development by 2030.
  - 40 miles, or 21%, are specifically slated for construction by 2030










### CENTRAL OHIO GREENWAYS TRAIL OF REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

 A Trail of Regional Significance is a primary trail, predominantly off-street, multi-jurisdictional, and connects people to major destination points.






### CENTRAL OHIO GREENWAYS GATEWAY OF REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

### PREMIER TRAILHEADS | COMMUNITY GATEWAY




Trailheads are the backbone of any trail wayfinding system. As gateways to both trails and the places they run through, trailheads have extraordinary capacity to influence trail users' wayfinding experience — and thereby their overall experience of trails. This chapter reviews the current state of wayfinding support offered via trailheads along the Ohio to Erie Trail in Central Ohio and provides recommendations for optimizing these spaces to better serve trail users with the information and amenities they need.







### Paint Creek Rec. Trail Stats

- Originally started in 1994 by the Tri-county Triangle Trail Group. This 34 mile paved Rail to Trail walking/biking path runs from Fayette County to Chillicothe City line.
- Growing to connect with Dayton/Xenia
- > 22 miles managed by Ross County Park District
- Almost entirely on the old Baltimore Ohio Rail line and over more than 15 bridges. Some of which are over 300 feet long.
- > Passes through multiple townships and small towns/historic areas.







#### Description

The Blacklick Creek Greenway Trail is a 14.7-mile one-way hike that weaves users through the scenic Blacklick Creek greenway corridor. Users of this trail travel through several small parks from Reynoldsburg to Groveport, as well as three Metro Parks: Pickerington Ponds, Blacklick Woods, and Three Creeks. Franklin County Metro Parks manages all sections of the Blacklick Creek Greenway Trail. While the trail itself is long, the elevation gain is extremely short for 14 miles at just over 350 feet in total. The trail is paved and ADA compliant.
